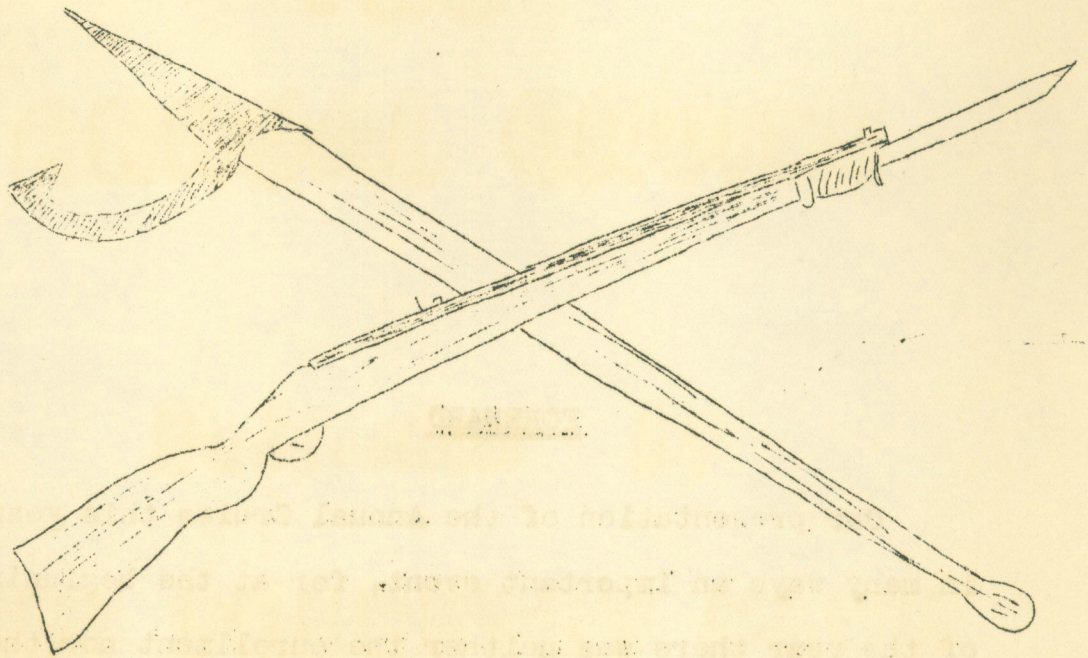

FOREWARD

Post-War Forestry Education

This subject is of major concern to all forestry educators. Considerable thought is being given to the type of program that will be in vogue in the forestry schools after the war. While it is possible that there will be several modifications of any current program, it is certain that there will be relatively few radical changes. The current plan of forestry education is quite sound as it considers a broad, basic college education of approximately two years in length followed by two years of technical forestry courses. There is considerable feeling that this four-year course should be extended to five years for the under-graduate degree. This thought has merit but several basic educational philosophies are involved. The time for the general acceptance of this change is not immediate, especially at Oregon State.

There are, of course, many problems associated with forestry education in the post-war period. Several of them are: increased enrollments, need for curricular revision in view of advancements in forest practices and utilization, the demands for trained foresters especially by industry and the returning war veterans. The problem of staff is not a minor one as many of the men on leave may not wish to return because of the attractiveness of government or industry positions.

There is no question but what there will be an increase in college enrollments; at least 50 per cent over 1940 figures. This will not be confined to forestry, as all indications point to a strong interest in college education, especially in engineering, agriculture, forestry and mechanic arts. A recent survey by the Portland office of the Veterans' Administration showed that of 161 disabled servicemen contacted, 24 wished to take college work in forestry. This interest is also evidenced daily by correspondence from high school boys and men in the service. Some of the latter have had college work; others have not finished high school.

The federal government is certain to make adequate provision for the education of veterans of World War II. The legislation has not been passed but it indicates that perhaps every veteran will get the opportunity to spend at least one year in college. Those who have the inclination and the aptitude will be permitted to go for a longer period at government expense. The general trek to college will be influenced of course by work opportunities, but all institutions are preparing for an enrollment of 50 to 100 per cent increase over the pre-war period. This will tax the physical facilities of every college as well as create many other problems.

There is an active demand for the vocational type of instruction in forestry as well as in other fields. Many of the individuals, even those with some college work, feel that they wish to spend a minimum of time in college. This is due perhaps to the fact that many are married, more mature and relatively older than the average college student. Time is a distinct factor with them. There is a place for the vocational forester, however, the somewhat limited employment possibilities will be a factor to consider seriously. The philosophy of the Civil Service examinations during the past decade and the attitude of industrial groups do not offer too much encouragement. The individual might fit himself for a part-time or seasonal job, combining it with some other trade. A fire protection job or one with a woods operation could very well be associated with certain agricultural or industrial positions. There need be no conflict between this and the professional training as the objectives are different.

The forestry school people here in the West are especially interested in these problems. The heads of the eight Western forestry schools met at Spokane in February for a two-day conference. The session was of extreme interest and benefit to all and considerable unanimity of opinion resulted. The major discussion centered around a five-year curriculum, job training, vocational training and the returning veterans.

It will be recalled that for the past few years there has been some attention given to an apprentice training program with forest industry groups. Dr. Emmanuel Fritz of California has lead this discussion at the Pacific Logging Congress on several occasions. Forestry educators feel that more attention could be given to the training of men for industry if the men might be assured of jobs. The Northwest offers possibilities in this regard. The students can easily get acquainted with the problems of the logging operation and the sawmill during the school term. Positions with an industrial concern could be arranged for the summer season. After graduation the work might be continued on the same type of job or preferably some associated activity. If this assurance for employment is given and there is the proper correlation during and after college between the school and the employer, considerable promise can be given for the project.

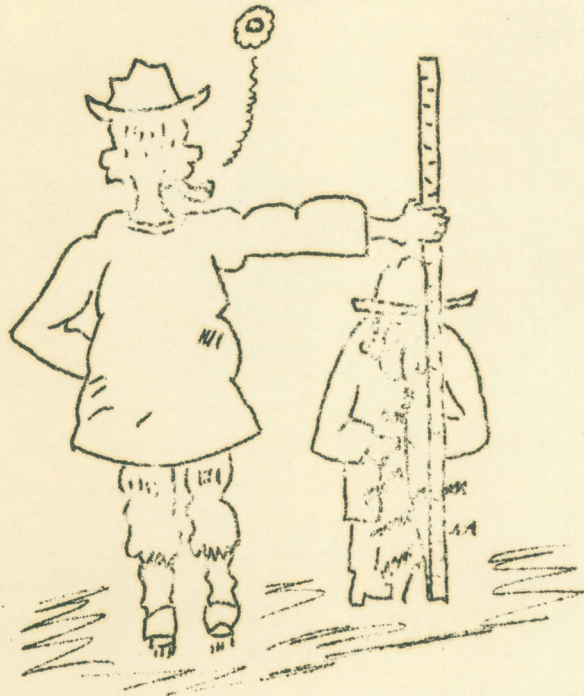
The opportunities for industrial forestry work are increasing. The expansion of interest on the part of the timber companies, the promotion of Tree Farms and the advancement of forest management in general, all will mean more positions for foresters. The increased interest in more complete wood utilization, refinements in the sawmills and the development of chemical processes will add to this total. The schools must be certain that they train the men adequately. This will mean a sound general training. In several cases that could well be followed by a period of specialization. This specialization could be given at the institution as graduate work or might be of the apprentice training and on-the-job type.

Many of the forestry students who are in the armed forces are inquiring about what will be available for them on their return. These men fall in two classes; those who did not complete their work, and the graduates. The former group can well fit into their places in the regular curricula. For the others, review or refresher courses will be provided. In general this study should largely be the individual's own responsibility. However, the school can prepare outlines, lists of reading material and case studies. Certain scheduled trips to typical operations might well show the changes and progress in forest, logging or sawmilling practices. Perhaps several will wish to initiate graduate programs. This will undoubtedly be a wise choice for some and the schools are making plans for this.

To further comment about the five-year curriculum the group at Spokane felt keenly that before a school should expand any curriculum, it should first be certain that it had reduced the course content of its present courses to real worthwhile material. It was felt that some curricula contained too many separate courses and the courses carried too much credit. This might provide a place for additional courses of other character.

The foregoing general statements will all apply at Oregon State and it is hoped that by the time you follows return that a well rounded comprehensive program will be in effect. There are new fields to consider as well as the present ones. There is a place for more emphasis on the training of industrial foresters, as well as technicians with a knowledge of all phases of wood utilization. Forestry is a broad subject and becoming broader each day. Education must keep pace with the practices and uses.

OREGON FOREST PRODUCTS LABORATORY

The Oregon Forest Products Laboratory is continuing work on projects related to the overall problem of developing economic outlets for the wood material produced in the forest. The greater part of the projects undertaken in the past three years and those under way now are aimed at utilization of waste material from the sawmill, plywood plant, or logging operation. The projects now being worked on are carbonization, sawdust plaster, Douglas fir bark, Scholler lignin, and hardwood seasoning.

The carbonization project has as its objective the production of charcoal briquets from sawdust or hogged waste. The charcoal briquets would be suitable for metal - lurgical coke or as a high heat value fuel. A secondary objective is the recovery and use of the distillation products, principally the tar. A pilot plant for producing charcoal has been erected and is operating satisfactorily; this plant consists largely of a rotary retort through which a continuous stream of sawdust is heated, dried, and carbonized. Briquetting equipment has been installed and preliminary work done on the production of charcoal briquets, using the finely divided charcoal and a suitable binder.

The sawdust plaster project is out of the laboratory stage and large scale applications are now being tried. The formula for the plaster consists of adding finely divided wood material to ethyl cellulose softened in alcohol and diluted with paint thinner. The resulting mixture can be trowled on as a thin coat over low grade boards or plywood, giving a plaster-like material.

Considerable work on the extraction of cork from Douglas fir bark developed a satisfactory process for drying the bark and separation of the cork layers from the red material. Present work is directed toward use of the entire bark, since even high grade bark from the stumps and butt logs of selected trees yields only 40 to 50 % cork.

Completion of plans and tentative War Production Board approval of an industrial alcohol plant at Eugene operating on wood waste has brought the the Laboratory the problem of use of the lignin residue. This lignin, termed Scholler lignin, has a small amount of cellulose and can be burned for fuel at the plant. However, the success of this process, operating on wood, in competition with alcohol plants using molasses, grain, or petroleum seems to depend on obtaining a higher value outlet for the 50 tons of lignin resulting from each day's operation. Accordingly, investigation has been started on the feasibility of certain large scale outlets for this material.

The scarcity of suitable hardwoods in the West points up the problem of utilization of the species available in this region. One of the principal deterrents to the use of many of the native hardwoods has been the difficulty of seasoning. A recent leaflet entitled "The Essentials of Kiln Drying Oregon Hardwood Lumber," which brings together available information regarding the seasoning of hardwoods, has recently been published. In addition, drying experiments on Oregon White Oak, one of the most refractory species to season, have recently been undertaken; the objective is the development of optimum kiln drying schedules.

The work of the Oregon Forest Products Laboratory is under the direction of Paul M. Dunn, and is guided by an advisory committee composed of industry representatives. The staff of the laboratory includes Dr. Lee K. Friedman of the Chemistry Department, Dr. E. G. Locke, who is supervising the carbonization project, Cornelius Papp, research assistant under Dr. Friedman, George Rieck, research assistant and graduate student in chemical engineering, Gene Tower, in wood products, and Glenn Voorhies, in wood products, who recently returned from the U. S. Forest Products Laboratory.

CASCADE HEAD FIELD TRIP

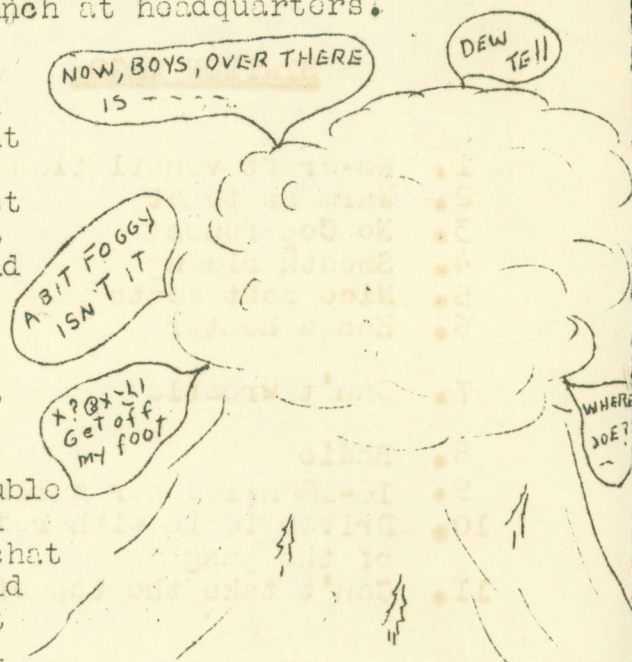

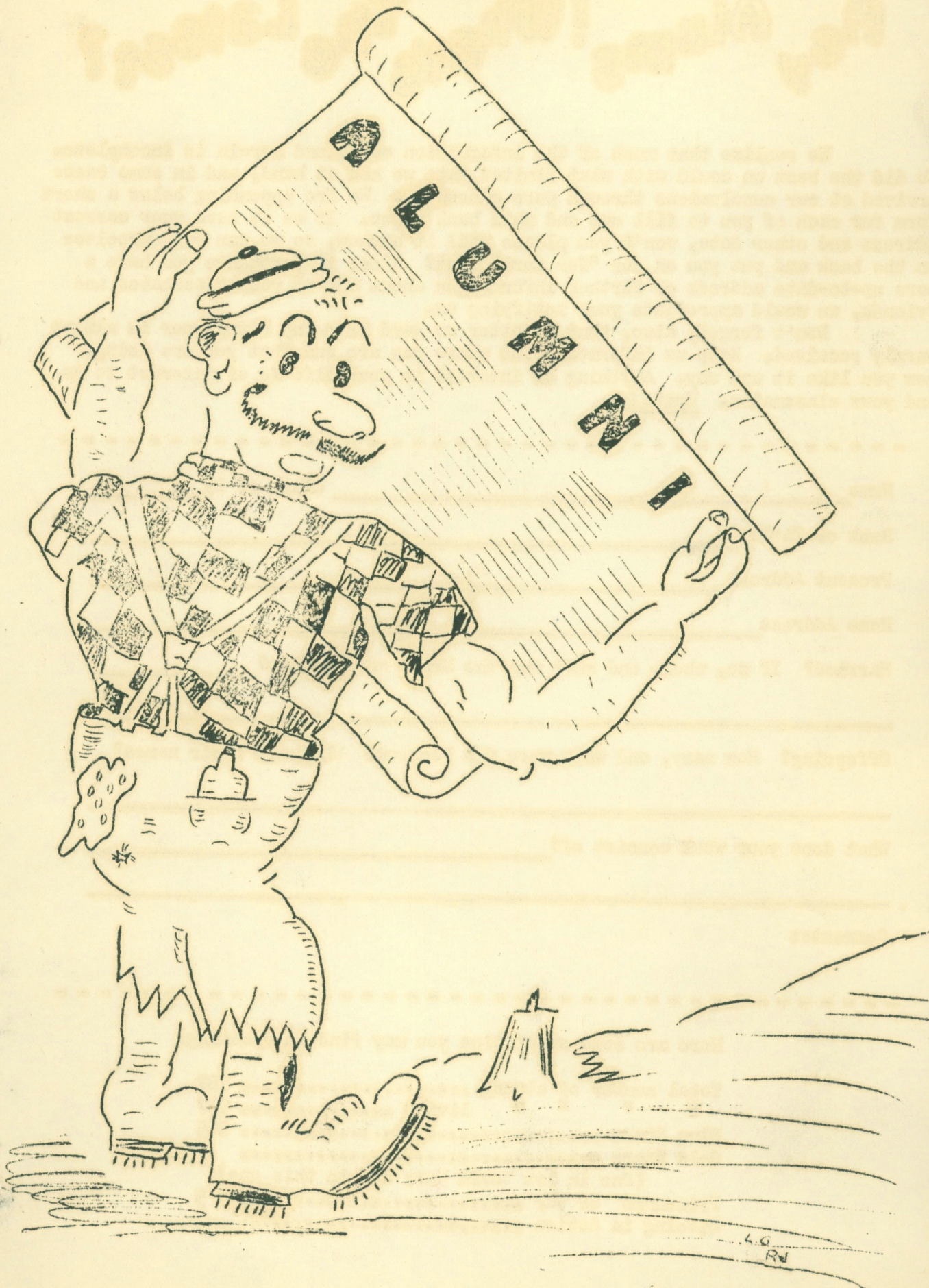
